Persistent varicose veins after GSV ablation





- 56-year-old female with symptomatic left lower limb varicose veins
- Symptoms: She feels heaviness, achiness with standing. She used compression stockings with improvement, but they are not so comfortable to wear
- PMH Left GSV laser ablation in 2016
 - After her procedure she was not happy as her varicose veins decreased slightly in size, but her symptoms did not completely resolve
 - She did not follow up and comes now with worsening symptoms
 - Denies pelvic symptoms













GSV in thigh not visualized

GSV in calf not visualized




Medial thigh varicose veins 4mm







SSV thigh-extension with no reflux
